Organized in 1651 on the banks of the Charles River by the Reverend John Eliot, its mission was to reach out to native peoples with the gospel and respond to their circumstances. By 1799, the native settlement was gone and the fourth meetinghouse was built in the center of Natick to serve the needs of a growing town. This was the beginning of the rich history of First Congregational Church of Natick.



The Cabell-Lincoln County Work Camp provides a mutual experience of work, worship, study, and interaction between youth and adults from different cultures and denominations so that they, together, may celebrate their oneness in Christ and minister in God's name to those in need.

The Camp has been working in various counties of West Virginia since 1966. This is a relational work camp concept and during these years approximately 1,575 homes and hundreds of thousands of labor hours have been involved. Churches and individuals have donated more than \$445,000 to purchase material for these needed home repairs.
